

From the Pastor

After Jesus told His disciples to “let your light so shine before men.” He then began a fairly lengthy discourse about God’s law and righteousness. He spoke words in Matthew 5:17 that the churches of this world do not understand or believe. Jesus clearly said, “Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I do not come to destroy but to fulfill.”

However, the vast bulk of the churches of this world believe that Jesus came to do away with the laws of God. Many twist Paul’s words to the congregations in Rome and Galatia to say that he said the law was not necessary to keep. Peter recognized that some things Paul wrote were hard to understand (but not impossible) and were twisted by many. 2 Peter 3:15-16 records Peter’s words “and account that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation—as also our beloved brother Paul, according to the wisdom given to him, has written to you, as also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things, in which are some things hard to understand, which those who are untaught and unstable twist to their own destruction, as they do also the rest of the Scriptures.”

Many today also twist Jesus’ own words in Matthew 5:17 to try to say Jesus was setting aside the laws of God when He said He came to fulfill the Law.

Man does not want to submit to God—to live by His Law; therefore, man does all he can to try to twist the words of the Bible to support the erroneous view that we no longer need to obey the laws of God. The idea that many put forth is that since Jesus fulfilled the Law—lived by God’s laws—He lived them for us; and, as a result, we don’t need to live by them—He obeyed them so we don’t have to.

This idea misses Jesus’ point completely. When Jesus fulfilled the Law He completed it. He did not do away with it. The Greek word translated “fulfill” is “pleroo.” Pronounced “play-ro’-o.” It means “to make full, to fill up, i.e. to fill to the full; to render full, i.e. to complete.” (Online Bible Greek Lexicon) We see this meaning in other verses.

Matthew 13:47-48, “Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a dragnet... which when it is full [pleroo]...”

Luke 3:5, “Every valley shall be filled [pleroo]...”

Colossians 2:10, “and you are complete [pleroo] in Him...”

What Jesus was saying in Matthew 5:17 was that He did not come to destroy the Law and the Prophets but to complete them—to bring them to the full. This is prophesied in Isaiah 42:21 “The Lord is well pleased for His righteousness’ sake, He will magnify the law and make it honorable.”

Jesus magnified the Law—completed the Law—when He taught the Spirit of the Law; adding it to the Letter of the Law. Christ gave several examples of magnification of the Law in much of the rest of Matthew 5.
