

From the Pastor:

The next passage reveals how clearly and how regularly God should be in our minds. In other words, we should be seeking to live in harmony with the words of God minute by minute every day? Therefore, we must ask ourselves, “Is becoming godly (actually striving to live by every word that proceeds out of God’s mouth) something that motivates our conduct (that which proceeds from our hearts)?”

1 Peter 2:13-14 records, “Therefore submit yourselves to every ordinance of man for the Lord’s sake, whether to the king as supreme, or to governors, as to those who are sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of those who do good.”

The Greek word translated “ordinance” is an interesting word. It is “ktisis.” It is used 19 times in the New Testament. It is translated as “creature” 11 times, “creation” six times, “building” once and “ordinance” once. Danker’s Lexicon defines it as “an act of creation,” “the result of a creative act, that which is created,” or, a “system of established authority that is the result of some founding action.” Ordinances – man’s laws – are ordained [created] by the established governmental authorities.

In this verse “ktisis” would mean “submit yourselves to all the edicts of established authority.” This is why these two verses say submit to the “king as supreme or to the governors...”

But, the passage records, “submit yourselves to every ordinance of man [that which has been created by man’s authority] for the Lord’s sake.” The reason Peter gives for submitting to the king [who was Nero at the time] or governor is for the Lord’s sake. In other words we submit to man’s laws out of respect for God.

Remember the “therefore” at the beginning of the scripture. The “therefore” connects the previous thought with the one that follows. The previous verse stated, “Having your conduct honorable among the Gentiles.” The example we set must be one of being godly law-abiding citizens. Obeying all laws out of respect toward God first and not just respect toward man’s laws.

Remember what Paul said in Romans 13:1-2, “Let every soul [person] be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God. Therefore whoever resists the authority resists the ordinance of God, and those who resist will bring judgment on themselves.”

As much as human beings may despise governmental authorities, all authorities only have power because God has allowed them to have it – whether they be good or bad. Peter carried this principle over to those who were slaves in 1 Peter 2:18, “Servants [Greek – oiketēs – a slave who was considered a member of the household] be submissive to your masters with all fear, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the harsh.”

Again, our obedience to the laws of man is to be out of our respect toward God and not just man.

But, as we know the only time we do not obey man’s laws is when they would require us to violate God’s laws as Peter was recorded saying in Acts 5:29, “We ought to obey God rather than man.”

However, when there is no conflict God expects us to obey the laws of man as if they came from Him.
