From the Pastor

The next section of the Sermon on the Mount is found in Matthew 6:24-34. Jesus introduces this section by saying in verse 24, "No one can serve two masters for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon [margin – riches].

It is very natural and easy for us (since we are physical beings living in a very real physical world) to focus almost exclusively on seeking the physical necessities imposed on us in this physical life. We must earn a living—provide the necessities of life for our families and ourselves—food, clothing, and shelter. The endeavor of meeting these needs is very real to us.

The problem is that we can become so focused on pursuing these things that we do not focus on (we forget) the real purpose for which we have been given this life. Jesus deals with these issues directly in verses 25-32. Jesus then states what needs to be the priority of our lives—what we should focus on first and above all. In verse 33 He said, "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added to you." Do we believe this?

Seeking God's kingdom simply means doing what we must do (live the way God wants us to live) to inherit life in God's family. To inherit life in God's family we must be seeking righteousness—learning to live pleasing to God—living by what God says is right—instead of doing what is simply pleasing to the self.

We must ask ourselves, "Is seeking to build a relationship with God something that is important to us?" To build a relationship with God takes time and effort—just like building a relationship with anyone. There is only so much time in the day. Is seeking God something we want to do? Do we want to do it badly enough to dedicate the time necessary to prayer, study, fasting, and meditation? Again, the answers to those questions will depend on how real God is and how important it is to us to draw closer to God—to serve Him.

Paul exhorted the brethren in Thessalonica with these words, "Finally then, brethren, we urge and exhort in the Lord Jesus that you should abound more and more, just as you received from us how you ought to walk and to please God..."

As we approach the Passover, we need to analyze our lives and answer, "Is seeking God's ways most important to us?"
