

From the Pastor:

The next passage describes how we should view ourselves and how we should be conducting our lives. 1 Peter 2:11-12 reads, “Beloved, I beg you as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul [life], having your conduct honorable among the Gentiles, that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by your good works which they observe, glorify God in the day of visitation.”

The words “sojourners” and “pilgrims” are from two different Greek words [sojourners – paroikos; pilgrim – parepidemos] which have similar meanings. From Danker’s Lexicon “paroikos” [sojourner] means “pertaining to being a resident foreigner...one who lives in a place that is not one’s home.” Whereas “parepidemos” “pertains to staying for a while in a strange or foreign place.” Therefore, a pilgrim [parepidemos] is a temporary resident (one who passes through); whereas, a sojourner [paroikos] is a more permanent resident of a place that is not his home.

The point is: we must view this world as not being our home. We are not a part of it and should not become a part of it. Paul in Philippians 3:20 wrote, “For our citizenship is in heaven...” Peter just wrote in 1 Peter 2:9 and 10 that we are God’s “own special people,” and we “are now the people of God.”

We must understand that we are children of God’s kingdom and family (1 John 3:2). Our conduct must be in harmony with that truth (Ephesians 4:1; 1 Thessalonians 2:12).

Therefore, Peter continued by saying, “abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the life.” As Christians we must not be conformed to the ways of this world which are the ways of selfish lust and pride as John wrote in 1 John 2:15-17. “Do not love the world or the things in the world – the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life – is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever.”

1 Peter 2:12 is fairly self-explanatory. We must always conduct ourselves in a godly way. People may criticize what we believe; but, they should not be able to find fault with how we live.

“The day of visitation” refers to the time when God comes to judge in the future. The Greek word is “episkope.” The meaning according to the Online Bible Greek Lexicon is “that act by which God looks into and searches out the ways, deeds, character of men, in order to adjudge them their lot accordingly, whether joyous or sad.”

God will reward us (and all others) according to our works – how we live (Psalm 62:12; Job 34:11; Jeremiah 17:10; Matthew 16:27; Romans 2:6; 1 Corinthians 3:8; 2 Corinthians 5:10). As you can see there are many scriptures (and this doesn’t list all of them) that show that God will reward us according to how He has judged what we do.

Peter is emphasizing that though we live in the world we must not let the ways of this world influence how we live.
