

From the Pastor

Continuing with our study of Jesus' teaching in the Sermon on the Mount the next section in Matthew 7:1-5 deals with the subject of judging others. Jesus' first statement is "Judge not that you be not judged." The margin of the NKJV (published by Thomas Nelson, Inc.) for judge gives the word "condemn."

The Greek translated "judge" is "krino" in both verses 1 and 2. "Krino" like many words has more than one meaning (or, usages – i.e. it is used in different ways). According to Danker's Lexicon it can mean:

- To make a selection, select, prefer
- To pass judgment upon, judge, pass judgment upon, express an opinion about
- To make a judgment based on taking various factors into account, judge, think, consider, look upon
- To come to a conclusion after a cognitive process, reach a decision, decide, propose, intend
- To engage in a judicial process, judge, hale before a court, condemn, hand over for judicial punishment (Danker lists Matthew 7:1, 2 in this usage)

We have always taken this verse to mean "do not condemn so we will not be condemned." The point being that we must not be presumptuous and take to ourselves a prerogative that is God's alone.

God is the sole judge of what issues from a person's heart. David was inspired to write in 1 Chronicles 29:17, "I know also my God, that You test the heart and have pleasure in uprightness..." In Psalm 50:6 (a psalm of Asaph) we read, "Let the heavens declare His righteousness, for God Himself is Judge."

Paul in Romans 2:16 wrote, "In the day when God will judge (krino) the secrets of men by Jesus Christ, according to my gospel."

But, we must understand that "krino" (to judge) does not always refer to a prerogative of God. In John 7:24 we read, "Do not judge (krino) according to appearance, but judge (krino) righteous judgment." We all must evaluate the rightness or wrongness of our actions. We are exhorted to examine ourselves before the Passover and always (1 Corinthians 11:28; 2 Corinthians 13:5).

Sometimes we also examine other people's actions, but, when we do God gives warning about motes and beams (Matthew 7:3-5). Further, in Galatians 6:1-5 Paul gives the following instructions, "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted...But let each one examine his own work... For each one shall bear his own load."
