

From the Pastor

An important aspect of the New Testament meaning of the Feast of Pentecost is the Holy Spirit (as clearly seen in the events of the Pentecost of Acts 2). On Pentecost in 31 A.D. God began to build His New Testament Church by giving His Spirit to the 120 disciples who were assembled keeping this Feast of God.

Many go to great lengths to describe the Godhead as a trinity of beings—three beings (persons) in one god. This false concept has become the basis of the view of the Godhead in churches today though it did not take its final shape until late in the fourth century A.D.

The word “trinity” is never used in the Scriptures though some will persist in quoting 1 John 5:7-8 to prove that the concept of the “trinity” is biblical. These verses in the NKJV are, “For there are three who bear witness [in heaven: the Father, the Word, and the Holy Spirit; and these three are one. And there are three that bear witness on earth:] the Spirit, the water, and the blood; and these three agree as one.”

All reputable theologians recognize that the words that are enclosed in brackets above are spurious additions that are not supported by the vast majority of Greek manuscripts.

The margin of the 1983 NKJV published and copywrited by Thomas Nelson has this footnote, “a passage found in Greek in only four or five very late mss. [manuscripts].”

The Jamieson, Faussett, and Brown (JFB) “Commentary on the Whole Bible” gives the following comment:

“The only Greek MSS. in any form which support the words [the words in brackets above] are the Montfortianus of Dublin, copied evidently from the modern Latin Vulgate; the Ravianus, copied from the Complutensian Polyglot; a MS. at Naples, with the words added in the margin by a recent hand; Ottobonianus, 298, of the fifteenth century, the Greek of which is a mere translation of the accompanying Latin. All the old versions [of the Vulgate] omit the words. The oldest MSS. Of the Vulgate omit them; the earliest Vulgate MS. which has them being Wizanburgensis, 99, of the eighth century.”

Scholars recognize that even the Greek manuscripts that have these words are translations of the Latin Vulgate. In other words, they are a product of the church at Rome.

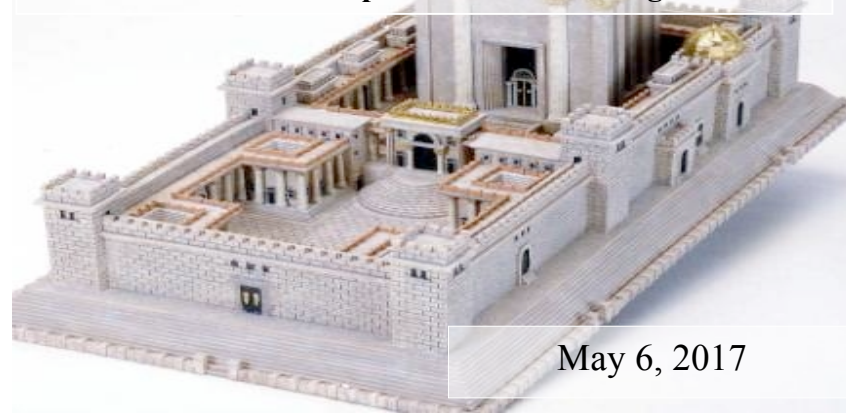
The JFB, however, goes at some length using human reason to show “There must be some mystical truth implied by using “three” (Greek) in the masculine, though the antecedents, ‘Spirit, water, and blood,’ are neuter.”

The bracketed material above was added because the concept of three persons (beings) in a trinity cannot be found anywhere in the Scriptures. The trinity is a concoction of man’s reasoning. It was neither in God’s mind nor the minds of His people.
