

***From the Pastor***

Paul in his various letters (epistles) to the churches invariably in his introductory remarks uses the words:

“Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.”

Romans 1:7, “To all who are in Rome, beloved of God, called to be saints; Grace to you...”

1 Corinthians 1:2-3, “To the church of God which is at Corinth...Grace to you...”

2 Corinthians 1:1-2, “Paul, an apostle...to the church of God which is at Corinth...Grace to you...”

Galatians 1:2-3, “To the churches of Galatia: Grace to you...”

Ephesians 1:1-2, “Paul, an apostle...to the saints who are in Ephesus...Grace to you...”

Philippians 1:1-2, “Paul and Timothy...to all the saints...in Philippi...Grace to you...”

Colossians 1:1-2, “Paul, an apostle...to the saints...in Colosse...Grace to you...”

1 Thessalonians 1:1, “Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, to the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you...”

2 Thessalonians 1:1-2, “Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, to the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you...” Paul uses the exact same wording for the two letters.

1 Timothy 1:1-2, “Paul, an apostle...to Timothy, my true son in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord.” Paul here in his letter to Timothy changed the wording of his standard greeting slightly.

2 Timothy 1:1-2, “Paul, an apostle...to Timothy, my beloved son: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.” Again, Paul changed the wording slightly.

Titus 1:4, “To Titus, my true son in our common faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Savior.” Here we see another slight wording change.

Philemon 1-3, “Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus... to Philemon...Grace to you...” Paul again uses his standard wording.

We don’t find this standard greeting of Paul in Hebrews, but we believe Paul wrote the letter. But, in all of the other letters Paul mentions both God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Doesn’t this seem strange to leave one person out of this greeting if the Holy Spirit is indeed a coequal person in the Godhead?

The point is: Neither the apostles nor the early church viewed the Holy Spirit as a person (a being) in the Godhead. They understood that Holy Spirit is the power the members of the Godhead (the Father and the Son) use to do whatever they do.
