From the Pastor:

James 5:19-20 reads, "Brethren, if anyone among you wanders from the truth, and someone turns him back, let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save a soul [life] from death and cover a multitude of sins."

As we see here, the NKJV uses the word "turns." The KJV uses the words "convert" and "converts" respectively. The Greek is "epistrepho" which literally means "to turn" and is translated even in the KJV as "return, turn about and turn again." Epistrepho is the Greek word translated as "be converted" in Acts 3:19. It means to change one's direction.

We must understand that it is impossible to cause anyone to change their direction, turn around, or be converted unless that individual can recognize that they are heading in the wrong direction – unless they first have a change of mind or heart which is what real repentance is. In other words, a person must exercise his own free will (from the heart) to change his spiritual direction. As we have covered recently, God may be able to force people to obey – to comply with His commands (as He will do in the Millennium), but, He does not nor cannot force anyone to yield to obey Him from the heart and have them retain their free moral agency.

Turning from sin is a matter of a person's individual free choice. A person's sins can be pointed out to him, but, that individual must see his conduct as being sinful and then from his own heart freely choose to change his direction. No one can make him repent – not even God. True repentance (having a real change of heart) must come from a person's own free choice.

In James 5:20 the life that is saved from death is the life of the individual repenting. And, the "multitude of sins" that are covered are the sins of the individual repenting and not the sins of the person who points out the error of the individual's way to him, as some have assumed.

As we pointed out last time, there is no "amen" at the end of James. The letter ends rather abruptly without any closing remarks that we find in all the other letters of Paul and the other apostles (except 3 John). As we said before we can only assume what that means.

This concludes the letter of James. Where we go from here I have not yet decided. We may go on to 1 Peter, but, I haven't decided. If you have any requests, please let me know.
