From the Pastor:

Continuing with the discussion of 1 Peter 1:4-5 which we began last time. Verses 4-5 read, "to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

Last time we explained the incorruptible inheritance to which God has called us. That inheritance is said to be "undefiled" and which "does not fade away."

The Greek words for "undefiled" and "does not fade away" are both compound words that begin with the prefix "a" the meaning of which we explained last time. Remember the negative particle [prefix] "a" indicates the meaning to be the opposite of the root word to which it is attached.

The Greek word translated "undefiled" is "amiantos." "Amiantos" is a compound word consisting of the prefix "a" and a derivative of the verb "miaino" which according to Danker's Lexicon means "to cause something to be ritually impure, stain, defile." "Amiantos" according to Danker's means simply "pure" or "undefiled." The OBGL defines "amiantos" as "unspotted" and describes it as "that which is far removed from every kind of contamination." Therefore, our incorruptible inheritance has no trace of any stain of evil. It is totally pure as we will be when we receive our inheritance.

Our inheritance will also "not fade away." This phrase is from the Greek word "amarantos." "Amarantos" "is a compound word consisting of the prefix "a" and a derivative of the verb "maraino" which according to Danker's Lexicon means "to disappear gradually, die out, fade, disappear, wither of plants." According to Danker's "amarantos" means "pertains to not losing pristine quality or character, unfading." Therefore, our incorruptible inheritance will not change – will not lose its purity – its pristine nature with time (or, in eternity). This is an awesome gift from God that God will give to all who become His own children.

This awesome inheritance is "reserved in heaven" for us. Reserve is from the Greek "tereo." From Danker's "tereo" means "to cause a state, condition, or activity to continue, keep, hold, reserve, preserve someone or something." Therefore, our inheritance is waiting for us which Jesus will bring with Him when He returns (Matthew 16:27; Revelation 11:18).

All who will continue to live by faith in God by using the power of God (God's Holy Spirit) will receive the end result of their faith – their salvation – becoming a member of the family of God when Jesus returns (in the last time). It's good to read these verses and meditate on what they say. They reveal an incredible promise from God to all who will seek to live as He reveals.of His own will.

From Jim Franks:

As you know, Hurricane Dorian recently tore through the Caribbean and then up the East Coast of the U.S., all the way to Newfoundland in Canada. There was widespread damage and loss of life. There are still more than 2,000 people missing in the Bahamas.

Several have inquired about donating to help the brethren in the areas that were most affected. They have asked if we have a special fund to help the victims of Hurricane Dorian.

In COGWA, we have a standard International Fund that was begun several years ago in the wake of the typhoon that struck the Philippines. It is more efficient for us to maintain one central fund to assist the brethren whenever there is a storm or other natural disaster, rather than setting up unique, restricted funds after each incident. Most recently, we sent funds to Kenya to help the brethren there in wake of a severe drought that has led to food shortages.

If you would like to make a donation specifically for areas outside the U.S. that have special needs, such as those affected by Hurricane Dorian, you may send donations to the "International Fund," and they will be used to assist our brethren whenever we have these disasters. You can donate online by using the drop-down menu on COGWA's donation page and selecting the entry for "International Fund." Or you may send checks to the regular COGWA donation address and designate on your check that the funds are to go to the "International Fund."
