From the Pastor

God's exhortation to His people through Paul in Ephesians 4:1 (NKJV) is sobering when we understand what our Father is saying to us. "I, therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you to have a walk worthy of the calling with which you were called..." The Authorized Version (the Old King James Version) uses the phrase "walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called..." The NKJV use of the word "calling" is the primary translation of the Greek word.

Our Father wants us to walk worthy of our calling. That is a sobering statement because God has called us to be His own children. To be worthy means to have fitting value or merit. Therefore, to walk work of our calling would mean that our true conduct flowing from our heart will accurately reflect the values of a son or daughter of God. As a result our conduct should reflect the very nature of God whether living before others (being seen by others) or when by ourselves alone.

In Romans 8:29-30 we see that our calling is to give us the opportunity to "be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren." This is what we must be doing to achieve the purpose of our calling. To become the very sons and daughters of God we must seek to walk as Jesus Christ walked (1 John 2:5-6)—to be conformed to His image. We must grow to have His same spirit, character, attitude and approach; but, sadly, this where we all fall down.

We don't seek to learn the qualities of Christ's character and then seek to live by those qualities 24/7. We still respond too much to life according to the old habits we have learned and developed. However, we will not change this habit pattern unless we actually put out conscious effort to do so. Such changes will not just happen by themselves. Unless we are actively working at changing we will not change. But, we must change if we are going to walk worthy of our calling.

We have covered the seven steps for overcoming sin in a sermon. We must all review those steps and use them. There is an article on the Life Hope and Truth website on that subject as well. It is in the Change silo (one of the six subject headings on the top of any page on the site). Those steps have been tried and proven. They do work. All we need to do is want to use them. If we keep in mind God's exhortation to walk worthy of the calling wherewith we have been called, we should be prodded to spend the time needed in changing.
